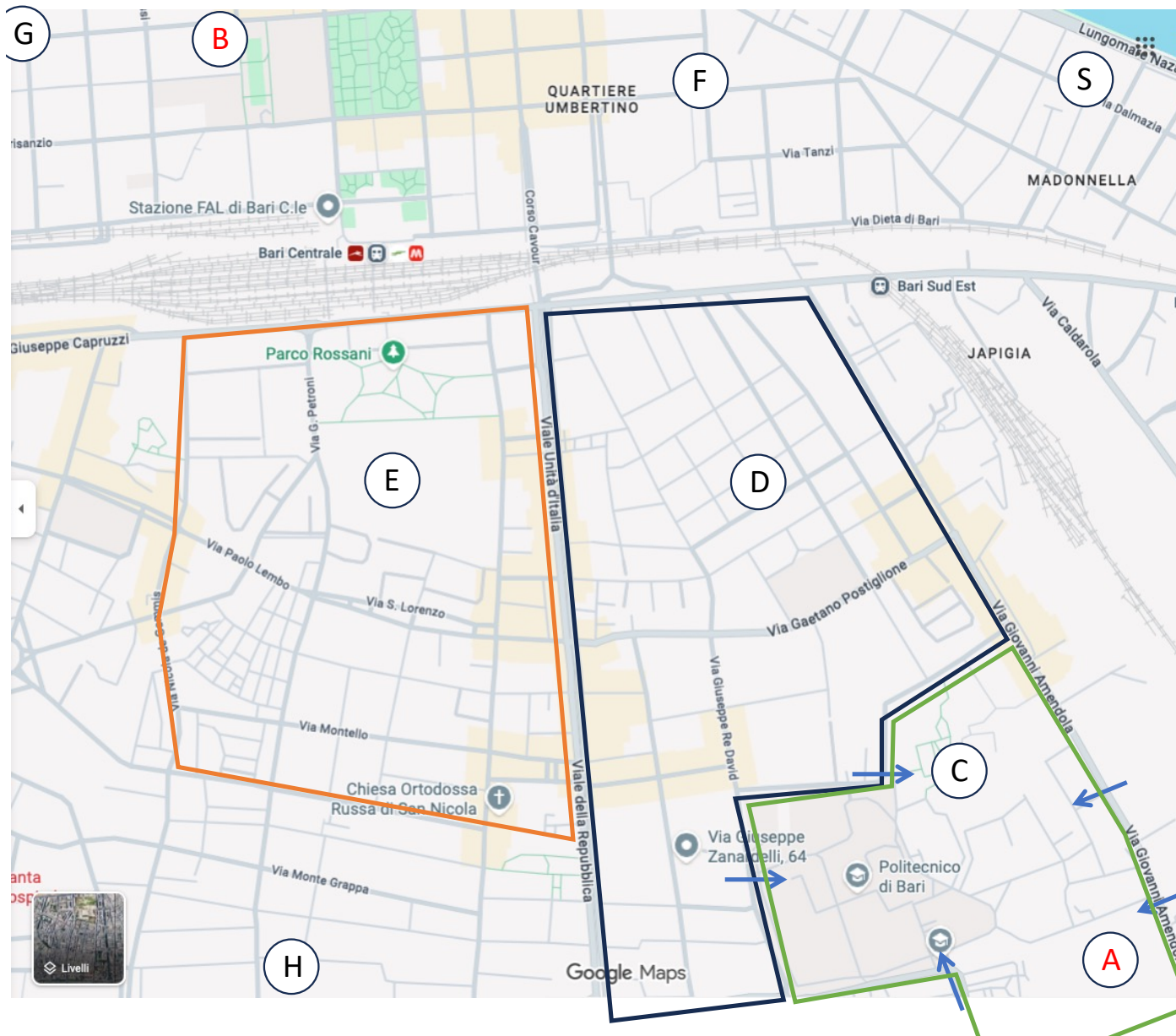

Comments

From A to B is 35' walk.

All city is quite walkable.

Bus service is not reliable in Bari.

e-bikes and e-scooters are provided by VAIMOO and LIME (helmet required).

Taxi fares from airport are fixed (25-30€ depending on the district). Bus shuttle (Tempesta) and train (Appulo Lucane) run 6 - 23 to/from Central station (5€, < 30'). UBER or BOLT are only convenient for long-distance trips, definitely NOT within the city.
